

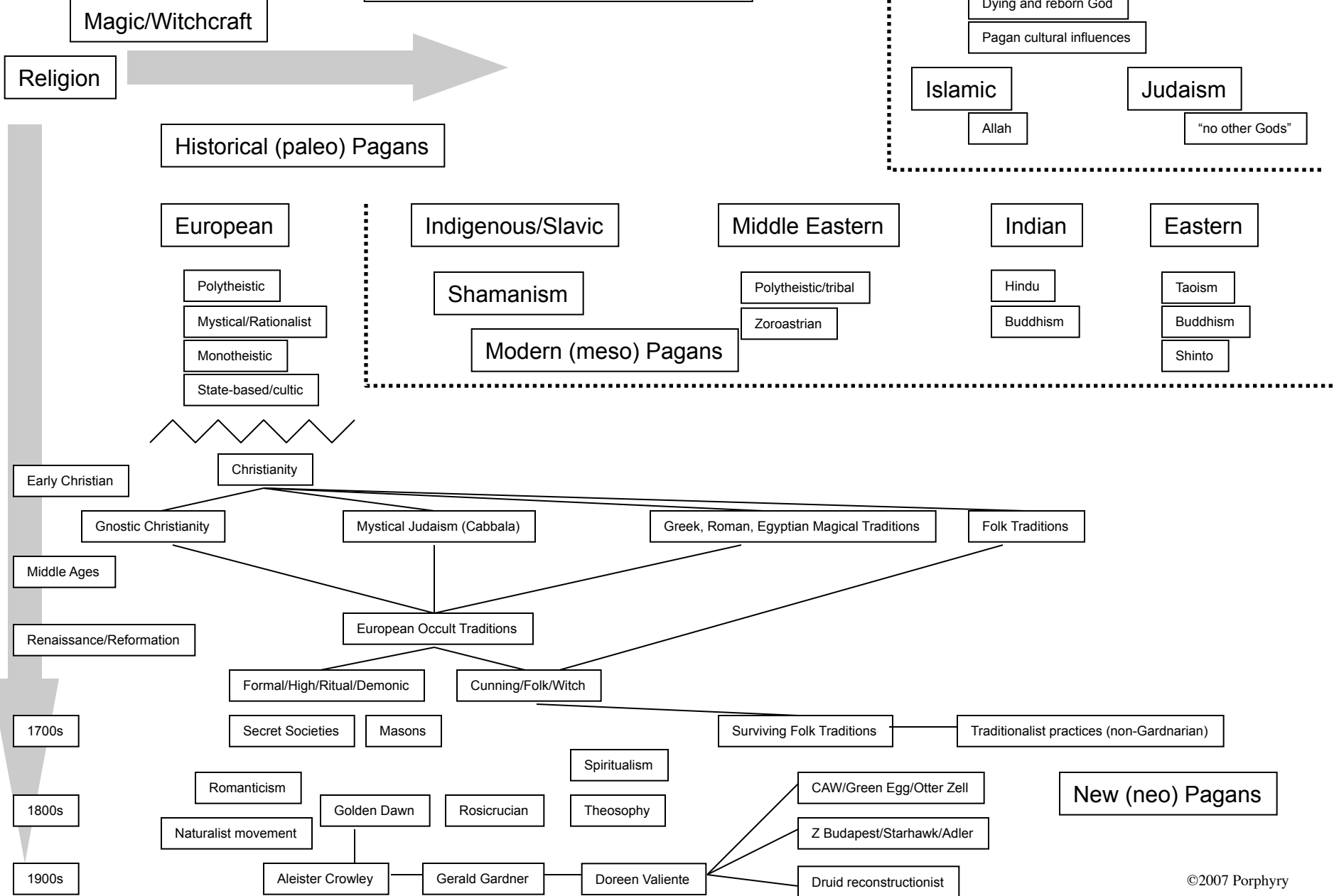
Defining Pagan

- Intuitive (we just know)

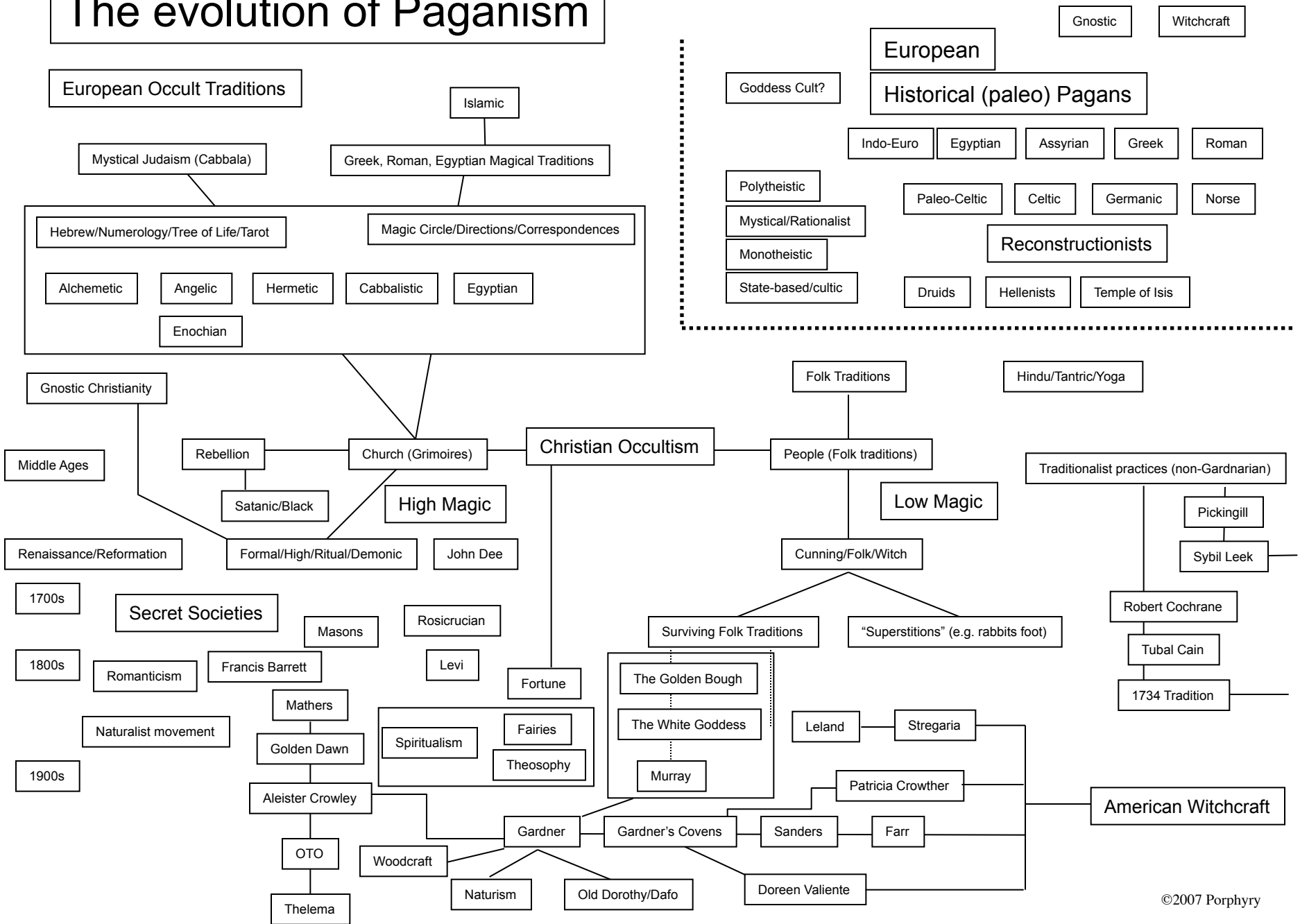
Disclaimers on the following slides

 - Eventually all this will be narrated, but not here, not now

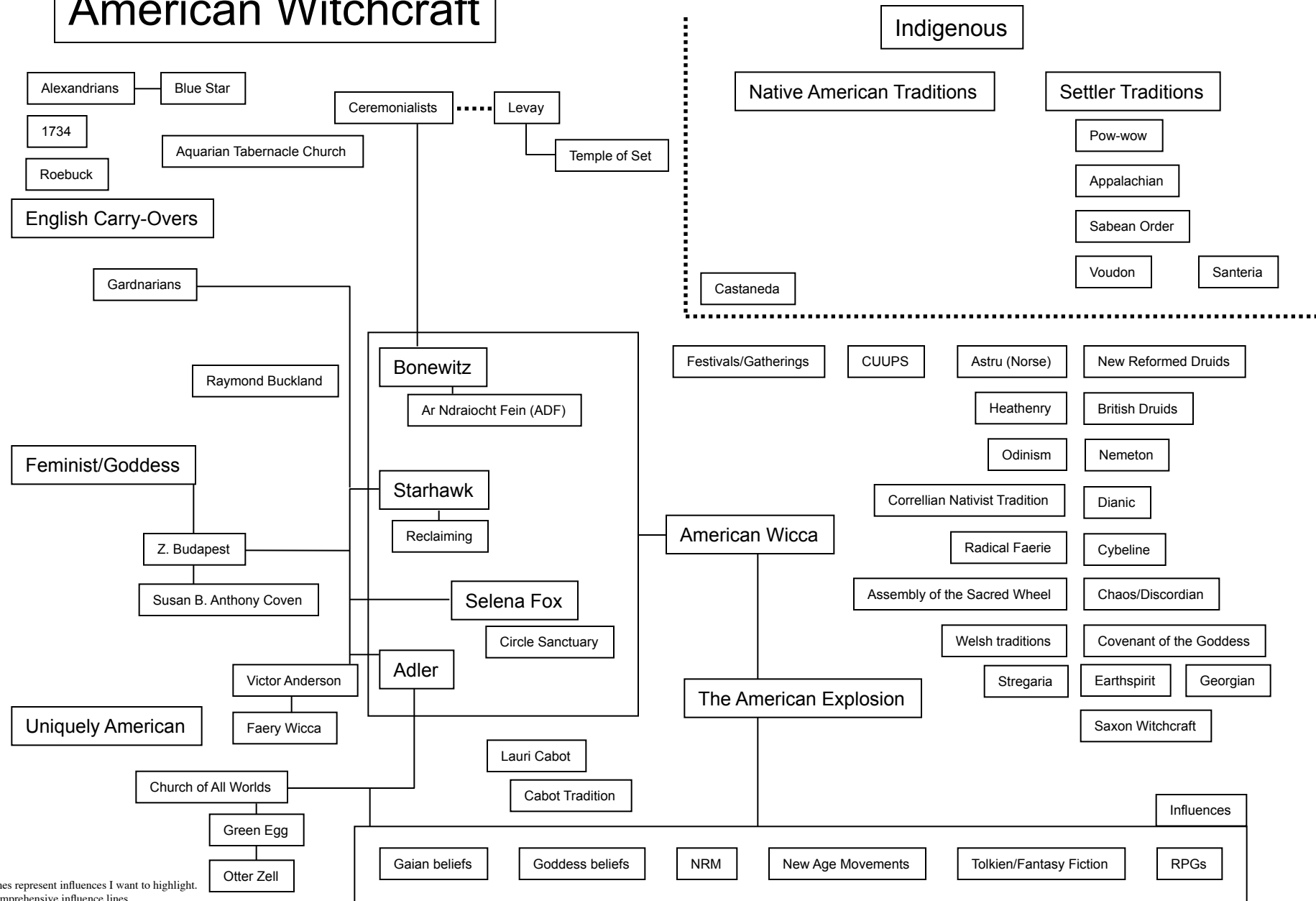
What is a Pagan?
